How to identify apple varieties

Fruit trees requiring cross-pollination include apples, plums, and pears. Other fruit trees, such as apricot, peach, and nectarine, are self-fruitful, which means pollen from the same cultivar in the area can pollinate the tree. With self-fruitful varieties, however, the fruit is enhanced if more than one fruit tree is planted in the area.
