The term "biophilia" was popularized by psychoanalyst Erich Fromm in the 1960s. In his work, he used the word (from bio-, meaning "life," and -philia, meaning "friendly feeling toward") to describe the biological drive toward self-preservation.

Biophilia hypothesis, idea that humans possess an innate tendency to seek connections with nature and other forms of life. The term biophilia was used by German-born American psychoanalyst Erich Fromm in *The Anatomy of Human Destructiveness* (1973), which described biophilia as "the passionate love of life and of all that is alive."

The biophilia concept states that we are drawn to environments that have supported human life in the past, so responding to nature is part of our genetic makeup.
