In the late 1970s and 1980s, social learning theory was adapted to emphasize the cognitive aspects involved in learning from the social environment (Bandura 1986). In 'cognitive social learning theory,' emphasis was placed on the processes involved in creating expectancies of other's behaviors and how these expectancies guide one's own actions.

### **A Psychological Approach to Understanding the Social and ...**

Social Cognitive Theory (SCT), the cognitive formulation of social learning theory that has been best articulated by Bandura, explains human behavior in terms of a three-way, dynamic, reciprocal model in which personal factors, environmental influences, and behavior continually interact (See Figure 3).
