Recognition of the world of Human communication (HC) is necessary for fathoming Mankind's promise. Theorising about HC under the prevailing definition is often one-dimensional and linear. A model constructed from a pentad of dimensions demonstrates that HC can best be fathomed under a model that recognises its multidimensionality (five dimensions – 5D) and the unified features of transaction of meaning-sharing in its entirety.
